

# LOCKDOWN TRANSITION BETWEEN LEVELS 5 & 4

The government has implemented a phased lifting of the COVID-19 lockdown.

ALERT LEVEL 4 commenced on 01 May 2020, with further amendments to definitions as per Gazette on 12 May 2020.

Please note that this list is a Level 4 list, which includes certain items from level 5 that remain unchanged. Items unchanged from level 5 are marked as RED and new items now allowed are marked in BLUE.

Level 4 is still constituted as essential-only services and hence those who are operating are required to have a permit with ID, as well as a copy of the completed FORM 2 from Government Gazette, 29 April 2020 (i.e. Permit to perform an essential or permitted services).



- Exercising under strict conditions.


# Categorisation of ESSENTIAL GOODS and SERVICES

Any food product, including non-alcoholic beverages.





# **CLEANING AND HYGIENE PRODUCTS**

Hand sanitiser, disinfectants, soap, alcohol for industrial use, household cleaning products and personal protective equipment.



#### **FOOD SERVICES**

(Restaurants/Fast Foods/Coffee Shops)

The sale of hot cooked food, only for home delivery.



#### **HEALTH AND BEAUTY**


Toilet paper, sanitary pads and tampons and condoms.

Personal toiletries, including haircare, body and face care products, rollons, deodorants, and dental care products.

Products for the care of babies and toddlers.


